



Allotments Newsletter

Welcome to the 2007 NHDC Allotments Newsletter!

The last twelve months has seen continuing strong demand for allotment plots across the district. Waiting lists are being kept under control with initiatives such as more frequent cultivation checks to speed up changeover of tenants and allocation of 5-pole plots rather than 10. NHDC currently serves over 100 more allotment gardeners than 2 years ago.

NHDC Allotments Strategy

The North Hertfordshire District Council Allotments Strategy is now drawing dividends with over £35,000 of investment in much needed improvements at Old Hale Way. Roadways have been rebuilt, fencing replaced, new gates, new water standpipes to improve availability and as always, rubbish removal.

Waiting Lists

What do you mean waiting list, that plot is so rough it must be vacant?

Well no, it may well be uncultivated (about 5% of plots are at any one time) but all plots are tenanted. Non-cultivation is a nuisance to neighbouring tenants and unfair to prospective tenants on waiting lists keen to get started.

It may be that the tenant is suffering a period of illness or family trauma or may just have lost interest. That is why regular cultivation checks are made during the season. Non-performing tenants are contacted as to their intentions and asked to cultivate their plots by a certain date.

Then what?

A proportion of non-performing tenants will respond by declaring they wish to continue or wish to relinquish their plot. The plots of those who do not respond are inspected again.

If found still to be uncultivated, the tenants are informed that their allotment agreement has been cancelled and the plot is re-let.

Similarly, if a plot fails a cultivation check on two consecutive occasions.

This process is irrespective of the annual rental period.
