




# Allotments Newsletter

# Welcome to the 2008 NHDC Allotments Newsletter!

Once again the last twelve months has seen continuing strong demand for allotment plots across the district.

There are presently 680 allotment plots in the urban areas of Hitchin, Baldock and Letchworth managed by NHDC.

About half of current tenants have been allotment gardeners for less than 4 years.



### **Old Hale Way**

The Hitchin Bee Centre "Buzzworks" continues to take shape. Members have completed stage 1 with the construction of their Bee equipment shed and Bee lawn. Group leader Robin Dartington recently presented the project to Hitchin Area Committee for support and is also working towards a WREN (Landfill Tax Scheme) to raise funds for stage 2 – Community Bee Garden, Discovery Centre and plant nursery. #### **Maintenance Works**

Throughout the Autumn of 2007 extensive maintenance works took place on most sites with fencing replacements, new gates, new padlocks, new water standpipes and roadway repairs.

As always, extensive resources were used in yet more rubbish removal!

The major proportion of the rubbish was green waste. There is no need for this, green waste should be composted on tenant's individual plots utilising composting equipment such as displayed below obtainable from local garden centres. Any pernicious weeds should be stored in a plastic sack until unrecognisable and then added to the compost bin.



2007 saw the transfer of Allotment Administration from Leisure Services to the Customer Service Centre. The CSC currently deals with 6-10 communications concerning allotment provision every day.
